During the tenure, she also sits in the "Falls: Patient and Safety Goal" committee for which she developed the Falls Intervention Team (FIT). She has also initiated the Geriatric Teleconference Visit (GTV) Clinic, a virtual clinic during the Covid-19 Pandemic 2020. She has presented in numerous National and International Scientific Conferences, and published papers on geriatric related topics. Dr Nordiana has also co-written in several books and guidelines; including The Position Statement in Delirium (2017) and Falls Guideline for Hospitalized Older Adults in the Ministry of Health Malaysia (2019). She also participates in the development of the Guidelines for the Prevention of Influenza in Older Persons Currently, she is practising in KPJ Damansara Specialist Hospital as Consultant Geriatrician and Physician, and is also the Chairman of Fall Prevention Committee in KPJ Healthcare.
